COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHTBULBS

"Local stores are selling all types of energy efficient Compact Fluorescent Lightbulbs (CFLs) for \$.99 each, through the end of March at least, thanks to discounts from Efficiency Vermont. The discounted CFLs include regular spirals, 3-ways, dimmables, floods, globes and capsules. CFLs use one-quarter the electricity of incandescents and last much longer. They do contain small amounts of mercury and should be recycled or returned to the store of purchase after the sale. Local retailers carrying the discounted bulbs include Fogg's Ace Hardware and Building Supply in Fairlee and Norwich, Welch's True Value in Woodstock and S.
