Sunday, February 12: A Sea Change. This award-winning documentary about ocean acidification follows the journey of retired history teacher Sven Huseby through stunning ancestral sites (Norway, Alaska, and the Pacific Northwest) on his quest to discover what is happening to the world's oceans. Excess carbon dioxide is dissolving in our oceans, changing sea water chemistry. The more acidic water makes it difficult for tiny creatures at the bottom of the food web to form their shells.
