BIRDS OF THE FLOODPLAIN FOREST AND FARM

Saturday May 19th 7:30 – 10:00 AM Meet at Post Mills Congregational Church on Route 244

We are privileged to have Dr. George Clark lead us as we watch for birds while strolling along the Ompompanoosuc River and Cross Road Farm to some light morning refreshment at the greenhouse.

In addition to being a noted ornithologist and bird walk leader extraordinaire, Dr. Clark is a retired Professor of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at the University of Connecticut, Past President of the Northeastern Bird Banding Association, a Coordinator for the Second Vermont Breeding Bird Atlas and writer for 22 species accounts in the forthcoming Atlas book. Among his birding finds was an unanticipated discovery of what is the only known site where both Yellow-bellied Flycatchers and Blackpoll Warblers nest in Orange County.

The land we'll be walking contains one of the largest remaining parcels of floodplain forest in Vermont including the uncommon slippery elm as well as a number of significant botanical, animal and bird habitats within its relatively small area.

You'll want to bring binoculars, bug repellent and waterproof footwear.
