FINDING ATTIC HEAT LOSS ON A SNOWY ROOF

One of the greatest sources of heat loss in many homes is air leakage – warm air pushes up and out openings high in the home and pulls cold air in openings low in the home. Hence it is called the "stack effect".

One easy way to identify the "stack effect" in your home is to look at your roof in the days following a snowfall. Warm air escaping the house into your attic will leave melt patterns in the snow on your roof. If the melting is bad enough, you might also end up with ice dams forming at your eaves, where there's no more building heat, and the melted snow refreezes.

Melted snow patterns on your roof and ice damming at your eaves are 2 good signs that you have heat loss in your home and opportunities to save.

So what to do?

Find the leaks in your home allowing warm air out and cold air in, then seal them with caulk and spray foam. See more tips at http://www.serg-info.org/energysaving-tips/
