FREE LED BULBS!

Thanks to a generous Thetford donor, families who meet the income guidelines below are eligible to receive up to five FREE energy s a v i n g, l o n g l a s t i n g L E D (Light-Emitting Diode) bulbs. These bulbs will save money, reduce your energy use and protect the planet by cutting greenhouse gas emissions. The bulbs are available at the Thetford food shelf and through the Thetford Elder Network and town churches as long as they last.

These LEDs produce the same light as a 60-watt incandescent bulb, but use only 10 watts. Replacing one 60W incandescent that you use an average of five hours a day with a 10W LED will save you about \$13.70/year in electric use!

These LEDs are rated to last 25,000

hours or almost 14 years if used five hours a day – about 10 times longer than an incandescent. And they are fully dimmable – you may need to change your dimmer switch to one compatible with LEDs.

To get the most out of these LEDs, we suggest you use them to replace the incandescent bulbs that run the longest in your home and relegate the incandescents to infrequently used places like closets.

The original Thetford Academy was situated just north of the Eclipse Grange in Thetford Hill. TA educated girls from the start, becoming Vermont's first coeducational secondary school. Goddard, the building with the cupola, was erected in 1818; the dormitory at its right was added in 1845.

A fire destroyed the academy in 1942, taking with it the dormitory, the town library, and another building as residents and students scurried to save books and furniture. Miraculously, there were no fatalities. Coal in the academy's cellar smoldered for months, even as students returned to school in borrowed quarters just one week later. TA reopened across Academy Road in 1949.
