

80 years ago this month, in March 1936, record floods hit North Thetford. The village did not sustain severe damage, but nearly 200 people died across New England as up to 30 inches of rain and snow fell over a period of two weeks. That same year, President Roosevelt signed the Flood Control Act of 1936 that led to the construction of the Union Village Dam in the 1940s.
