DRIVE CAREFULLY!

The seventh grade science classes at Thetford Academy are learning about some of Thetford's environmental resources. Jim McCracken, a member of the Conservation Commission, visited classes and shared a presentation about vernal pools and the animals that rely on them. After learning about these unique habitats, the 7th graders brainstormed ways that they could help to protect vernal pools and the animals that frequent them.

We are asking all Thetford residents to be careful driving in Thetford this season. Amphibians such as frogs and salamanders cross roads to get to vernal pools (small pools that appear in spring and give them a place to mate and lay their eggs). This occurs in spring on the first warm, rainy nights of the season. These creatures are very vulnerable. Every year about this time, frogs and salamanders are killed en masse by cars driving through Thetford.

To continue the reproduction of these important species, residents must drive slowly and with caution on rainy nights. If all residents participate, amphibians can reach their vernal pools and continue to live in our town.
