EAT WELL TO AGE WELL

Good nutrition is a key factor in lifelong health. Senior Solutions helps older adults access two programs that support healthy eating for seniors.

Meals on Wheels delivers meals to seniors who have difficulty preparing or shopping for meals due to temporary health problems or longer-term challenges. This program is for people aged 60 and up, and there is no income qualification. There is a suggested donation, but no one is denied service due to inability to pay.

3SquaresVT helps eligible Vermonters buy more nutritious food with an EBT card that looks like a debit or credit card. If everyone in the household is 65 or older or gets SSI, the benefits may be distributed as cash deposited directly into the family's bank account. 3SquaresVT is open to individuals and families who qualify based on household income. Anyone who is over 60 or has a disability may deduct many medical expenses from their income, which can help with qualification.
