Sign a contract with one of our partner contractors by May 31 and be eligible to win up to \$2,500 toward the cost of your home energy project, in addition to Efficiency Vermont rebates.

DID YOU KNOW?

Most weatherization projects focus on air sealing and insulation. According to Efficiency Vermont, the average cost of weatherization improvements in our region is \$7,800 (before rebates, which average around \$1,500), resulting in increased comfort and 26% average energy savings annually.

Rebates for Replacing Your Old Wood Stove with an EPA-Certified Model

Vermont's Clean Energy Development Fund has a new wood stove change-out incentive program!

Through participating retailers, you

can replace your old, in-use wood stove if it doesn't meet EPA standards (generally pre-1988 models) with an EPA-qualified cord wood or pellet stove. Program goals:

- Reduce emissions of wood smoke in Vermont
- Increase the use of cleaner wood and wood pellet burning stoves in Vermont
- Promote sustainable and healthy VT forest economy
- Support VT wood and pellet stove manufacturers and dealers

Local participating retailers include Home Comfort Warehouse in White River Junction and Woodstock Soapstone Company in West Lebanon. Rebates range from \$500 to \$1500 and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Find out if your stove qualifies and learn more at tiny.cc/ReplaceStoveVT.
