This form also outlines our policies and expectations for behavior, and should be read carefully with your child. These will be sent home on the first day of school at both TES and TA, and must be turned in on the student's first visit during the 2017/18 school year. Children in third grade and vounger are not allowed to use the library after school without a parent, guardian, or caregiver of at least highschool age.

Afterschool activities for kids in grades 4-6 will begin on Fri., Sept. 8, and run every Friday that Thetford Elementary School is in session, unless noted. Children may walk to Latham Library from school for stories, games, arts and crafts, and other fun activities.

The Community Nurse of Thetford is a free service for Thetford residents. The nurse can provide support, guidance, and education to individuals and families dealing with illness, aging, disability or family crisis.

Services include:

- Assisting individuals and families to understand instructions from their providers, especially correct medication taking.
- Assisting in coordination of post-hospital or skilled nursing facility care by communication with discharge planners.
- Helping persons in need of medical care to access the care they need.
- Linking individuals and families to community resources to help with transportation, getting meals and/or groceries, increase social interaction and assist with caregiver fatigue.
- Communicating with primary care providers, specialists and the VNA about changing needs.
