3SQUARESVT BOOSTS FOOD BUYING POWER

Many senior citizens are cutting back on their food budgets as expenses rise, but good nutrition is a key factor in lifelong health. To encourage healthy eating, the U.S. Department of Agriculture offers the 3SquaresVT program.

The benefits come on an EBT card; there are no "food stamps" anymore. If everyone in the household is 65 or older or gets SSI, then the benefits may be distributed as cash, deposited into the family's bank account.

3SquaresVT is open to individuals and families who qualify based on household income. Anyone over 60 or who has a disability may deduct many medical expenses from their income, which can help with qualification.
